Leon Löwentraut - Campaign #Art4GlobalGoals

Leon Löwentraut, who has made a name for himself in the last two years, is regarded as the international shooting star of the art scene. His single exhibitions in Singapore, New York, London, Basel and Berlin were sold out within minutes. His works have a distinctive style with an instantaneous recognition factor, inspired by artists like Picasso, Matisse or Basquiat. This style makes the Youngster one of the most demanded artists in the world. Seeking freedom in his art, Löwentraut combines colors and shapes, often times drawing directly out of the tube instead of using brushes. His subjects are versatile, dealing with humanity and interpersonal communication, oscillating between optimism and criticism, in many cases showing the person behind the social facade.

The young artist, who started drawing at the age of seven, lives and works in Duesseldorf, Germany, and since 2016 additionally in Havana, Cuba.

Löwentraut, who has been chosen to artistically interpret the Sustainable Development Goals of the World Community and the United Nations, the SDGs, has compiled a total of 17 unique artworks for the campaign #Art4GlobalGoals with the support of UNESCO, the YOU Foundation and Geuer & Geuer Art.
